

## **Loudonville P.D. Police Calls**

### ***03/29/2026 to 04/04/2026***

- 3/29 at 12:32am, Loudonville Police were advised that the Mount Vernon Police Department had located and arrested a 46-year-old male that had a Loudonville P.D. warrant. The warrant was for committing criminal trespass and disorderly conduct in Loudonville at an earlier date/time. Loudonville Police met with Mount Vernon Police and took custody of the male. The male was transported to the Ashland County Jail.
- 3/29 at 12:35am, police were requested to assist Ohio State Park Officers with a noise complaint in the Mohican State Park. After a thorough check of the area, no loud or unusual noises were located.
- 3/29 at 8:14am, a cellular phone was turned in to police. Police were able to identify and locate the owner. The phone was returned.
- 3/29 at 8:16am, police were called to assist a citizen in the 200 block of N. Spring Street with excessive vultures on her rooftop. Upon arrival, the vultures were already gone.
